To whom it may concern,

I am writing to you following my earlier objection to data processing, sent via aangetekende brief with PostNL and received by the Belastingdienst on the morning of September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

It has been one full month since that objection was received at the Belastingdienst, and contrary to its obligations under the General Data Protection Regulation, the Belastingdienst has failed to acknowledge or respond within a one-month time period.

Furthermore, within that one month time period, the Belastingdienst has not invoked its right to extend processing of the objection by up to two months.

Considering that the objection also notes dilatory aspects of the handling of the original Article 15 Subject Access request and Article 16 Right to Rectify requests, it is deeply concerning that this has not been acted on in a timely manner.

Attached to this letter is a copy of the delivery confirmation proving that the Belastingdienst has been in possession of the Objection to Data Processing for the last month.

I urge the Data Protection Officer to take the necessary actions to ensure that the Belastingdienst is fully complying with the General Data Protection Regulation and recent CJEU rulings concerning due process and adequacy of data protection legislation in third countries.

Acknowledgment of the original objection, this letter, and the issuance of a reference number (not containing my BSN) to refer to in future correspondence is appreciated and will make this much easier for all parties concerned.
